

I Introduction and Context

Thakur Ramnarayan College of Arts & Commerce (TRCAC) stands as a beacon of quality education, social commitment, and environmental stewardship. In response to evolving needs, TRCAC is committed to a 10-year Perspective plan (2020-2030) to propel the institution towards excellence, sustainability, and inclusive growth.

II Short – Term Goals (2020-2025)

1. Quality Enhancement

TRCAC is dedicated to enhancing the quality of education through multifaceted measures such as :

- Obtaining ISO 21001:2018 certification for adopting international quality standards in delivering education services.
- Organising faculty development programs, training programmes etc. for the faculty members for fostering innovative teaching methodologies and curriculum enhancement.
- Arrangement of regular workshops and seminars to ensure faculty members stay updated with the topics such as National Education Policy 2020, Intellectual Property Rights, Outcome based education etc. and to get well versed with latest pedagogical techniques.
- Promotion of research activity among faculty members by arranging for research conferences, workshops etc. resulting in increased publications, presentations at conferences, and engagement with the wider academic community.

- Establishment of a feedback mechanism for continuous improvement of academic programs, allowing students to express their views and suggestions for program enhancement.

- Scaling up of the Go Shoonya electric vehicle "Shoonya Rath" fleet for efficient garbage collection across Mumbai, reducing the carbon footprint associated with waste disposal.
- Collaboration with municipal authorities to optimize waste collection routes, reducing travel distances, and streamlining operations for greater efficiency.

- Establishment of Nature clubs comprising students, faculty, and staff, promoting environmentally responsible behavior, and organising awareness campaigns and workshops.

8. Future Courses


- Launch at least two new courses, integrating practical training, internships, and industry projects to equip students with real-world skills.

Strategic Plan for Quality Maintenance and Enhancement Initiatives


- Various quality maintenance and improvement activities are planned in the regular IQAC meetings by the IQAC.

Waste generated from the canteen is converted into manure using a decompose process, in both hand tumblers and ground pit.





Recycling of plastic waste by Go Shoonya

To support this mission, the institution started an initiative called GO SHOONYA - Neutrality Redefined, on 24th September 2021, to collect plastics in and around the college campus. Using plastic bags is minimized in campus stores and canteens and encouraged to use disposable eco- friendly paper plates and cups.
