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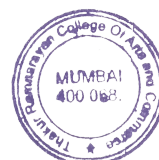
Degradable and Non-Degradable waste

Waste generated from the canteen is converted into manure using a decompose process, in both hand tumblers and ground pit.



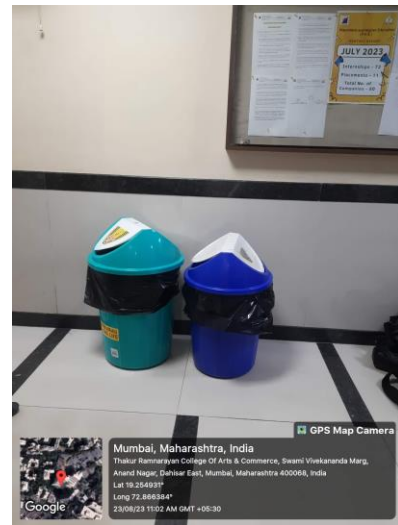
2. Recycling of plastic waste by Go Shoonya / Waste recycling

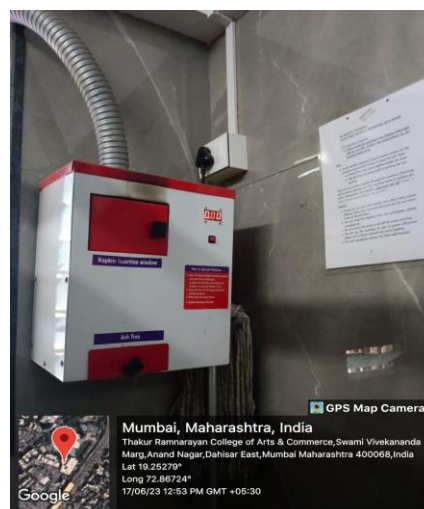


